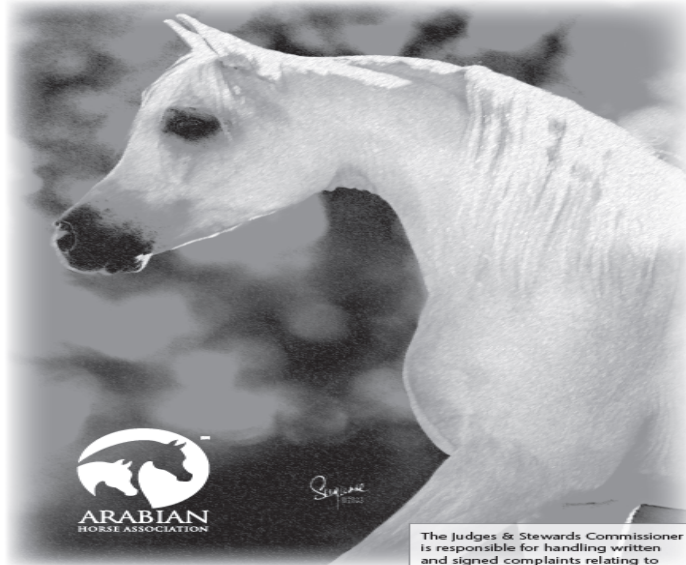

AHA Membership Statement - AHA Comp 301.10

Each competitor (this includes at least one recorded owner and all trainers, drivers, riders, halter handlers, coaches and the person(s) signing the entry blank in an Arabian Horse Association recognized Arabian division, at the time of entry into a competition, must submit a copy of a valid AHA membership or competition card, join AHA or pay an AHA single membership fee per competitor. When an agent signs for the owner at an AHA recognized competition, both the owner and the agent must be members of AHA or pay the AHA single event membership. Single event membership is not acceptable at AHA Regional or National competitions. Exhibitors in Walk/Trot classes are exempt from AHA membership requirements at qualifying competitions, but must have an AHA membership with competition card at AHA Regional and National Competitions. Exhibitors in Line classes or parents/Guardians signing for minors are exempt from AHA membership requirements.

Aurora Summer Show is sponsored by AHA, and is qualifier for the Region 17 Championship show along with qualification for the Canadian Nationals, U.S. Nationals, Sport Horse Nationals and Youth Nationals.

The Aurora Working Hunter Show is sanctioned as Bronze competition and is approved by Equestrian Canada,
308 Legget Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa Ontario K2K and is governed by the rules of EC.

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPAL

Statement of Principles

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

All Persons shall be committed to:

- upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives;
- continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- actively promoting the development of and adherence to competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

The Aurora Horse Show is a sanctioned Bronze competition member of the Equestrian Canada, 308 Legget Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa, Ontario K2K 1Y6 and is governed by the rules of EC (A602.1).

THE RULE BOOK

Exhibitors, Judges, Show Officials are responsible for knowledge of the Rules. Full details of Horse Show operation - EC (including F.E.I.) rules - list of recognized Judges - other vital information is in the RULE BOOK copyright for exclusive use of recognized shows. See current EC Rules and Amendments. Every individual is eligible to count points won at recognized EC Shows for EC Awards. The current EC Rules and Amendments are presently in effect and have been used to compile the Rules and Regulations for this prize list.

Regional & National Breed Shows need a Silver EC Sport License EC Article B1302.2

Membership to EC is now called a "Sport License". All exhibitors, owners, trainers, riders, drivers, handlers **must** join EC with a sport license to be able to compete in any EC sanctioned show. One show per year will allow a temporary membership, please see EC rules.

Amateur Competitors: All seniors competing in EC AMATEUR classes require a current Amateur card. This must be applied for at the same time as the "Sport License" through Equestrian Canada.

NEW 2019 – no additional fee for Amateur Status however you must complete the application on the EC website. If Amateur status is not showing on your Sport License then you must contact EC to get the correct card. Also, you must have a Provincial membership before you can apply for the EC License.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of the EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book and the current AHA Handbook and amendments. Therefore, it meets all requirements for eligibility of National and Regional Championship classes and Achievement Award points. In the case of any discrepancy, AHA rules will prevail for all Arabian classes and if not covered then the EC rules will apply. The Show Committee reserves the right to decide on any rule not covered by EC and/or AHA.
- Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition
- All AHA approved shows will use the current halter scoring system for Breeding & In-Hand Arabian & Half/Anglo Arabian halter classes as outlined in the 2017 AHA Handbook. You may review this system on the AHA website – Competition – Judges-Stewards section. The In Hand classes will use the current in hand score card.
- **All decisions made by the Show Committee are final.**
- “Any horse entered in any class at a competition may, while on the competition grounds, be selected for “equine medication control testing” while at the event location (A602.5)
- Grooms entering the ring are to appear neat, clean and suitably attired in the opinion of the Show Committee. (i.e. unmarked smock)
- No person other than the officials, steward, attendants on duty and the judge of the class may enter the show ring without the permission of the judge.
- Exhibitors are responsible for reporting all entries to the Gate Attendant ten minutes before each respective class is called for showing & must enter the ring promptly when called. Those not ready when called, may not be allowed to enter the ring to compete. No fees will be refund. Please be courteous & responsible.
- Horses shall not be punished unnecessarily or severely anywhere on the show grounds. Rules regarding cruelty and abuse are covered by the EC Rule Book and will be enforced.
- **COMPETITION NUMBERS MUST BE WORN AND VISIBLE AT ALL TIMES IN THE SCHOOLING AND EXERCISE RINGS. PLEASE COMPLY WITH THIS RULE** as requested by EC which also means the Show Steward will enforce it. (EC A814 and B1306.9)
- Any exhibitor using a wrong back number or having no number may be excused or disqualified from the class at the discretion of the Judge of the class. No fees will be refunded.
- Upon any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of the owner, groom, rider, driver or handler, the owner may forfeit his entry fee and such action will be reported to EC. The Show Management reserves to itself the power to remove any person or horse from the show grounds without being liable for compensation. The Show Steward shall have the full power to act for and on behalf of the Show Committee.
- Courses/patterns will be posted at least one hour before the class at the Show Office and/or in an area designated by the Show Committee.
- All horses artificially, improperly or unfairly prepared or tampered with before coming into the Show Arena will be disqualified. If it is ascertained that an exhibitor has made or caused to be made, a false statement in regard to any animal or article exhibited or if any exhibitor shall attempt to interfere with the judge in the performance of his or her duties, that exhibitor shall be excluded from competing or exhibiting. In such case of any animal being disqualified the winner of the next succeeding prize shall take the prize that has been awarded to such animal and lowest prize in the class shall go to the reserve number.
- The Show Committee reserves the right to add to, amend, or decide any point not covered by the rules and to correct any error or make any necessary alterations in the prize list or show program.
- For Arabian Division, Junior Horses are 5yrs & Under. For American Saddlebred horses, Junior Horses are 4yrs & Under. Other breeds as per their regulations.
- **Stallions will NOT be permitted in any Junior Showmanship, Walk, Trot/Jog and Lead Line classes**
Stallions are permitted in Junior Exhibitor Performance classes. **Age of a Junior is 18yrs & Under as of December 1, 2018**
- **Accidents and Return to Play** -- This rule is applicable to all competitors (including foreign) at EC sanctioned events and applies to falls/accidents that occur at the event location. . In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, (not limited to a direct blow to the head or loss of consciousness), the competitor must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel onsite,

through the EC Accident Injury Report Form before continuing. . The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place by the onsite qualified medical personnel. If the competitor refuses to be evaluated, he/she is disqualified from the event. If the qualified medical personnel suspects a concussion (regardless of symptoms displayed), or believes that the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor is suspended from competition until medically released, as outlined in paragraph 6 below. In the case of the preceding paragraphs, an EC Accident/Injury Report Form must be completed by either the attending Steward, Technical Delegate or the attending qualified medical personnel onsite and submitted to EC within 24 hours of the occurrence. It is the Steward's / Technical Delegate's responsibility to ensure forms are complete and submitted on time. Any competitor suspended from competing further at the event on the basis of any of the preceding paragraphs will be placed on a medical suspension list, managed by EC, until medically released as in the process described in paragraph 6. In the event a competitor is determined ineligible to compete per one of the above conditions, the competitor must submit the EC Return to Play Form to EC, completed by a licensed physician. The EC Return to Play Form will be processed by EC within two business days, at which point the competitor will be removed from the EC Medical Suspension list and may return to regular competition. If the competitor wishes to compete after being medically released by a physician but before the EC processing period of the form, the competitor must also submit a copy of the EC Return to Play Form to the show secretary. In this case the competitor is competing at their own risk and may be pursuant to fines and penalties if the form is found to be incomplete in any way. No competitor shall compete in an EC sanctioned event while on the EC Medical Suspension List. It is the responsibility of the competitor to refrain from competition and the competition organizer may refuse entry to anyone currently on the EC Medical Suspension List. These rules also apply to EC sanctioned competitors competing in FEI and USEF competitions.

Important!! PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING

1. Please read all rules and forms before completing. Errors are costly to everyone.
2. Full entry fees must accompany all entries – *No post-dated cheques – call Secretary to discuss if needed.*
3. Entries must be complete and **include copies** of the following:
 - a. **Current registration papers** - front & back **“must be in owner name for owner classes”**
 - b. Or a copy of **lease agreement** (must be registered) or **contract of sale** (dated & signed) – *No AO classes allowed*
 - c. Copy of **EC Sport License** for each owner, rider, handler, driver, person responsible (see A801.6) – seniors and youth, **PSO (i.e. AEF) membership** and **AHA Competition card**. EC will not accept membership purchase without first having a current a PSO membership)
 - d. **EC status** on a Sport License is mandatory if entering any amateur class – all breeds must adhere to this.
New 2019 – Amateur status is included in the Sport License with EC – however it must be applied for and must appear on your card.

Entries will be considered incomplete if submitted without copies of all registration papers & all membership cards and will be charged an additional \$10.00.

ELIGIBILITY

The following **are eligible** to compete at this EC & AHA recognized show: (refer to EC article A201 for further membership clarification)

1. **Horses** entering any classes (except those listed as All Breeds) must be registered with the Canadian Arabian Horse Registry (CAHR), the Canadian Partbred Horse Registry (CPAR); the Arabian Horse Registry of America or the Arabian Horse Registry of Colorado; **the American Saddlebred Horse Association of Canada (ASHAC)**; or any other duly recognized registry if the horse is owned by a citizen of a foreign country. For greater clarity, an American Saddlebred owned by an American citizen may be entered with a name and registration number from the American Saddlebred Horse Association. Horses must be entered under their full registered name with their registration number, or if an age specified by breed rules, as eligible for registration. Horses must be entered under the name(s) of the owner or lessee on record with the breed association. A copy of the registration papers showing recorded ownership or proof of lease must be submitted with the entry form at the time the entry is made.
1. Temporary memberships for the Arabian & HA/AA breed entries can be purchased for AHA. These memberships would only be in effect for this show and do not carry forward to any other Arabian breed show. Temporary memberships with AHA are NOT allowed at the Regional or National level.

Any person who has **NOT** reached their 19th birthday is regarded as an amateur and is called a Junior.

Junior exhibitors must also have a current membership in EC, PSO and/or AHA if over the age of 10 years.
2. **New 2019** - Combined ownership is allowed in Amateur Owner classes - See Equestrian Canada ruling on this new item.
3. “Limited” classes have been changed to “Select”. Therefore, “Limited” AOTR classes have been replaced with “Select ATR” classes. By changing AOTR to ATR, this will allow more exhibitors to enter these classes and changing the name to “Select ATR” will eliminate the confusion between “Limit” and “Limited”, that was previously an issue. Qualification & definition will remain the same. Select definition: “Refer to current EC Rules – Arabian Division for a detailed explanation of the “Select” division and what it means.
4. Hors Concour will be allowed at this show however the show secretary must be advised of this intention.
5. Substitution of a horse will be handled on an individual basis. Call the show secretary at (403) 863-1849

After June 21, 2019, all new entries will be considered as a late entry and will pay a late entry fee of \$25.00 per horse entered, no matter what postmark date is on the envelope.

1. Post entries for all classes will be accepted up to a full session before the class being entered at regular fee. No post entry fee will be charged if the horse was entered into the show prior to June 14, 2019.
2. Management agrees to cancel and refund entry & stall fees on any horse unable to show providing notice, in writing, is received by the Show Secretary on or before July 10, 2019. A \$25.00 processing fee will be charged with the office fee & number fee retained.
3. Exhibitors canceling their entries for any reason after June 21, 2019, will forfeit entry fees unless the Show Secretary receives a suitable Veterinarian Certificate attesting to illness or injury, in writing, before 6:00pm on Thursday July 11, 2019. A \$25.00 processing fee will be charged with the office fee & number fee retained. Stall fees will not be refunded unless ruled upon by the Show Committee.
4. The Show Committee reserves the right to cancel or combine any class with three (3) entries or less at the closing date of entries. If a class is cancelled, entry fees will be refunded. Large classes may be split at the discretion of the Show Management, with each section run back to back. Classes split by Age Grouping may be combined if the numbers do not warrant running as split.
5. There will be a \$25.00 charge for any returned or post-dated Cheque.
6. The Show Steward shall have full power to act for and on behalf of the Show Committee during the entire show.
7. The Show Committee reserves the right to add to, amend, or decide any point not covered by the rules and to correct any error or make any necessary alterations in the prize list or show program.
8. To determine the number of horses in each class:
All Classes Ridden as a group - It will be the number of horses that are competing at the closing of the gate at the beginning of the class. All those who pass through the gate in individual activity classes will determine the number of horses in each class.
9. The AHA Res. 9/90, AHA Show Fee and the Single Event Membership fees include the Canadian exchange fee.

AHA EQUITATION MEDAL CLASSES "Specifications" Please refer to the current Equestrian Canada Rulebook and the Arabian Horse Association Handbook.
Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book (A 602.2) **For all other class specifications refer to the current EC Rules and the current AHA Handbook.**

NOTICE – **ARTICLE A905 HEADGEAR

1. At all times, persons mounted or carriage driving at an EC-sanctioned event location must wear approved protective headgear as described below.

Exceptions: See discipline or breed sport rules: a) **Section B** – American Saddlebred: B302.2, B405.2, B902

b) **Section B** – Arabian: B1306.7, B1501.22, B1602.3, B1702.3, B1802.3, B1902.5, B2002.4, B2402.4, B2402.6, B2403.3, B2610.3, B3002.9, B3604.5, B3605.2, B3605.5, B3606.2 B3611.2. B3701.4,

c) Section B – Morgan: B5208.2, B5502.2, B5602.2, B5702.2, B5803.1(b), B5903.1-2, B6003, B6103.4, B6401.5, B6409.1, B6503 d) Section F – Saddle Seat: F2106

2. Protective headgear must be: a) approved by an accredited certification organization. See Glossary – Headgear Standards; b) properly fitted; and c) securely fastened by a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet.

3. Any competitor may wear approved protective headgear in any division or class without penalty from the judge.

4. EC makes no representation or warranty, expressed or implied, about any approved protective headgear. EC cautions riders and drivers that serious injury or death may result despite wearing such headgear, as all equestrian sports involve inherent risk, and no protective headgear can protect against all foreseeable injury.

All Breed Specifications: All Breed Classes and All Breed Equitation Classes will be conducted according to EC Section F General Performance All Breed Showmanship will be conducted according to EC Section F Chapter 18 General Performance pertaining to General Performance Showmanship At Halter.

OTHER SHOW INFORMATION

1. **Barn calls** are a courtesy only. Exhibitors are responsible for being ready to show when their class begins.
2. **Gate holds** will be granted at the discretion of Show Management. Please request ALL gate holds through the Show Office on the appropriate form. This insures that all personnel are informed of the gate hold and the judge is not kept waiting unnecessarily.
3. **Warm-Up Rings** – Lunging & Riding will occur in separate rings. If inclement weather prevails, separate times will be posted for each in the main ring. **Warm-ups Rings may be closed when show personnel are NOT present on the show grounds. This will be strictly adhered to as per EC recommendations.**

AURORA HIGH POINTS

Criteria: Must be an Aurora member in good standing for 2019. Points to be earned at up to 4 shows within Region 17. **One show MUST be an Aurora Show.** Others can include any class A show. Breeders & Region 17 Championships do count however National Shows do not count. Shows will be in the current year.

RULES REGARDING PROTESTS

A protest at an EC recognized competition, other than those specific matters covered in division rules, must comply with the following:

1. A protest is eligible only if made by the officiating Judge, an owner, lessee, trainer, competitor or authorized agent in the Division in which the question arises. A protest must be made in writing and addressed to the Show Secretary of the competition at which the matter under consideration occurs, must be signed and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 in cash. A copy of the protest must be sent to the EC National Office and applicable Provincial Office.
2. A protest must contain a specific statement of an alleged violation of a rule or of a condition of a class and must give the full name and, if possible, the address of the alleged violator. The maker of the protest must be prepared to substantiate the protest or charge by personal testimony, sworn statements, witnesses or other relevant evidence.
3. A protest must be filled within 48 hours of the completion of the class concerned. (A1204.3)
4. For further information regarding protests and appeals, refer to EC current Rule Book.
