STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of Horses in all activities under its jurisdiction. All Persons shall be committed to:

- upholding the welfare of all Horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
 - requiring that Horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
 - ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and Competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own Horses as well as Horses placed in their care for any purpose;
 - providing for the continuous well-being of Horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
 - providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives;
 - continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare; 2020 Rules of Equestrian Canada Section D Page vii
 - requiring owners, trainers and Competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
 - actively promoting the development of and adherence to competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the Horse.
- The standard by which conduct, or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

THE RULE BOOK

Exhibitors, Judges and Show Officials are responsible for knowledge of the Rules. Full details of Horse Show operation (EC (including F.E.I.) rules, list of recognized Judges) and other vital information is in the RULE BOOK copyright for exclusive use of recognized shows. See current EC Rules and Amendments.

- Membership in Equestrian Canada is now called a Sport License.
- All exhibitors, owners, trainers, riders, drivers, handlers must join EC with a Sport License to compete in any EC sanctioned show.
- Every individual is eligible to count points won at recognized EC Shows for EC Awards.
- The current EC Rules and Amendments are presently in effect and have been used to compile the Rules and Regulations for this prize list.
- Amateur Competitors: All seniors competing in EC Amateur classes require a current Amateur card. This must be applied for at the same time as the Sport License through Equestrian Canada. Amateur status is included in the license but must be checked off on the application for it to show up on the Sport Horse license.
- Bronze License - \$30.00 Silver License - \$105.00 Gold License - \$175.00 Platinum License - \$265.00
- An EC Bronze Sport License is the minimum required for the 2020 Aurora Summer Horse Show. Amateur status may apply. Visit www.equinecanada.ca to obtain sport license information.
- A Temporary Sport License is available for \$45.00, but it does not accrue points. One show per year will allow a temporary membership, please see EC rules.
- Regional & National Breed Shows require a Silver EC Sport License EC Article B1302.2
- A Provincial Membership from Alberta Equestrian Federation is mandatory before purchasing an Equestrian Canada (EC) Sport License. Annual AEF memberships are available at a cost of \$50.00 for an individual membership and \$110 for a family membership. Members of the AEF are automatically protected with a \$5,000,000. liability insurance policy for horse sport.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of Equestrian Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book and the current AHA Handbook and amendments. Therefore, it meets all requirements for eligibility of National and Regional Championship classes and Achievement Award points. In the case of any discrepancy, AHA rules will prevail for all Arabian classes and if not covered then the EC rules will apply. The Show Committee reserves the right to decide on any rule not covered by EC and/or AHA and their decisions will be final.

It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. Any changes or corrections will automatically become part of this Prize List.

1. ARTICLE A801 Every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the Person Responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. (602.7)

2. Exhibitors must ascertain when their horse will be judged. Calling of classes is a courtesy only. Exhibitors failing check-in at the Hitching Ring may have their horse excluded from their class. Those not ready when called, may not be allowed to enter the ring to compete and fees will not be refunded.
3. ARTICLE B3906 LEADLINE
 - a) Open to riders who are at least two years of age and have not reached their seventh birthday as of December 1.
 - b) Leaders must be at least 14 years of age.
 - c) The safety of all competitors must be of the primary consideration when conducting the class. Any action by any exhibitor, leader or horse that endangers that competitor or leader must be penalized and will be considered as cause for elimination.
 - d) Safety is of the utmost importance in tack and attire.
 - a. Saddle must fit rider.
 - b. Rider's feet must be engaged in the stirrups/irons.
 - c. Leading rein must be attached to a cavesson or a halter placed under or over the bridle.
 - d. Rider must wear properly fitting approved protective headgear.
 - e. Boots are required.
 - f. There shall be only one rider on each horse entered.
 - g. Stallions are prohibited.
 - h. Similar awards should be presented to all exhibitors. Not placed.
4. ARTICLE A814 Every entry must be provided an identification number by the competition organizing committee which must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and/or exercise areas as well as in the competition ring. Any exhibitor using the wrong number or riding without a number in the ring may be excused from the class or may be disqualified in the event of a protest or at the discretion of the Judge. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that they are wearing the correct number in the class.
5. Gate holds will be allowed at the discretion of the Show Committee and must be requested through the Show Office before the session starts using the appropriate form. The Show Committee will make every effort to accommodate tack changes; time restriction will be 3-minute gate hold and a 2-minute gate. Tack changes are to be completed in the Hitching Ring.
6. Courses/patterns will be posted at least one hour before the class in an area designated by the Show Committee.
7. Any horse entered in any class at a competition, may be selected for Equestrian Canada equine medication control testing at the event location. (A602.5)
8. No person other than the officials, steward, attendants on duty and the judge of the class may enter the show ring without the permission of the judge.
9. Horses shall not be punished unnecessarily or severely anywhere on the show grounds. Rules regarding cruelty and abuse are covered by the EC Rule Book and will be enforced.
10. Upon any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of the owner, groom, rider, driver or handler, the owner may forfeit his entry fee and such action will be reported to EC.
11. All horses artificially, improperly or unfairly prepared or tampered with before coming into the Show Arena will be disqualified.
12. If it is ascertained that an exhibitor has made or caused to be made, a false statement in regard to any animal or article exhibited or if any exhibitor shall attempt to interfere with the judge in the performance of his or her duties, that exhibitor shall be excluded from competing or exhibiting. In such case of any animal being disqualified the winner of the next succeeding prize shall take the prize that has been awarded to such animal and lowest prize in the class shall go to the reserve number.

ACCIDENTS AND RETURN TO PLAY

1. This rule is applicable to all competitors (including foreign) at EC sanctioned events and applies to falls/accidents that occur at the event location.
2. In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, (not limited to a direct blow to the head or loss of consciousness), the competitor must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel onsite, through the EC Accident Injury Report Form before continuing. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place by the onsite qualified medical personnel. If the competitor refuses to be evaluated, he/she is disqualified from the event.
3. If the qualified medical personnel suspect a concussion (regardless of symptoms displayed) or believes that the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor is suspended from competition until medically released, as outlined in paragraph 6 below.
4. In the case of the preceding paragraphs, an EC Accident/Injury Report Form must be completed by either the attending Steward, Technical Delegate or the attending qualified medical personnel onsite and submitted to EC within 24 hours of the occurrence. It is the Steward's / Technical Delegate's responsibility to ensure forms are complete and submitted on time.
5. Any competitor suspended from competing further at the event on the basis of any of the preceding paragraphs will be placed on a medical suspension list, managed by EC, until medically released as in the process described in paragraph 6.
6. In the event a competitor is determined ineligible to compete per one of the above conditions, the competitor must submit the EC Return to Play Form to EC, completed by a licensed physician. The EC Return to Play Form will be processed by EC within two business days, at which point the competitor will be removed from the EC Medical Suspension list and may return to regular competition. If the competitor wishes to compete after being medically released by a physician but before the EC processing period of the form, the competitor must also submit a copy of the EC Return to Play Form to the Show Secretary. In this case the competitor is competing at their own risk and may be pursuant to fines and penalties if the form is found to be incomplete in any way.
7. No competitor shall compete in an EC sanctioned event while on the EC Medical Suspension List. It is the responsibility of the competitor to refrain from competition and the competition organiser may refuse entry to anyone currently on the EC Medical Suspension List.

MEMBERSHIP AND REGISTRATION

1. Horses entering any classes (except those listed as All Breeds) must be registered with the Canadian Arabian Horse Registry (CAHR), The Arabian Horse Registry of America or the AHA; the American Saddlebred Horse Association of Canada (ASHAC); or any other duly recognized registry if the horse is owned by a citizen of a foreign country. For greater clarity, an American Saddlebred owned by an American citizen may be entered with a name and registration number from the American Saddlebred Horse Association, Inc.
2. Horses must be entered under their full registered name with their registration number, or if an age specified by breed rules, as eligible for registration. Horses must be entered under the name(s) of the owner or lessee of the record with the breed association. A copy of the registration papers showing recorded ownership or proof of lease must be submitted with the entry form.
3. **Each competitor (This includes at least one recorded owner and all trainers, drivers, riders, halter handlers, coaches and the person(s) signing the entry blank) in an Arabian Horse Association recognized Arabian Division, at the time of entry into a competition, must submit a copy of a valid AHA membership/competition card, join AHA or pay an AHA single event membership fee per competitor.**
4. **When an agent signs for the owner at an AHA recognized competition, both the owner and agent must be members of AHA or pay the AHA single event membership.**
5. **A single event membership can be purchased for this show through the Show Office for \$50.00 (\$35.00 USD + \$15.00 exchange) Single event membership is not acceptable at AHA regional or national competitions.**
6. **Exhibitors in Walk-Trot/Jog class are exempt from AHA membership requirements at qualifying competitions but must have an AHA membership with competition card at AHA regional and national competitions.**
7. **Exhibitors in lead line classes or parents/guardians signing for minors are exempt from AHA membership requirements.(BOD 5/12)**
8. Alberta residents who are owners and/or exhibitors of American Saddlebreds showing at the Aurora Summer Horse Show are required to hold a current year membership with the American Saddlebred Horse Association of Alberta (ASHA of Alberta) and show proof of membership with entry. See www.saddlebredsofalberta.com for the current membership form.
9. All Canadian resident owners and trainers of Canadian registered American Saddlebreds must be current members of the American Saddlebred Horse Association of Canada. Owners and trainers of American Saddlebreds from a foreign country must be current members of the American Saddlebred Horse Association, Inc. Visit www.saddlebred.com to obtain membership.

VACCINATIONS

EC ARTICLE A519: "All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event." (A602.8)

- Horses not in compliance with this rule will be asked to leave the event site by Competition Management.

The frequency of vaccine administration should be as recommended by the vaccine manufacturer or veterinarian. It is recommended that vaccines be administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

- Competition management requires supporting documentation confirming a horse's compliance with mandatory vaccination requirements.

If administered by a veterinarian, the veterinarian will provide documentation to the Person Responsible. If the veterinarian did not administer the vaccine, the Person Responsible will provide:

- the horse's name
- a receipt copy of the vaccine purchase
- name of the vaccine with serial number and expiration date
- the date administered
- a signature confirming all information is true and correct.

In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccines, a letter from a veterinarian on official letterhead must be provided with the entry form, stating the horse cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns. At the discretion of competition management, a log of the horse's temperature prior to arrival at the event site or during the event can be requested.

SHOW COMMITTEE

- The Show Committee reserves the right to add, amend or delete any point not covered by the rules & to correct any error or make any necessary changes in the Prize List or Program.
- The Show Committee reserves the right to add classes or make necessary changes to the tentative schedule but will exercise this with ample notice given to exhibitors affected by changes.
- The Show Committee reserves the right to cancel or combine any class with three (3) entries or less at the closing date of entries. If a class is cancelled, entry fees will be refunded.
- Large classes may be split at the discretion of the Show Committee, with each section run back to back. Classes split by Age Grouping may be combined if the numbers do not warrant running as split.
- The Show Committee will post all changes at the Show Office.
- The Show Committee reserves the right to approve proposed TBA classes for purchase.
- The Show Committee reserves the right to reject any entry at any time for any reason the Show Officials deem reasonable cause.
- The Show Committee reserves to itself the power to remove any person or horse from the show grounds without being liable for compensation.
- The Show Steward shall have full power to act for and on behalf of the Show Committee during the entire show.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Grooms entering the ring are to appear neat, clean and preferably attired in a white smock.
- Horses will be permitted to leave the show grounds during the competition and return as necessary.
- Riders are asked to mount their horses outside of the barn and dismount their horses before entering the barn as per insurance policy requirements.
- Arena hours open for riding and lunging will be posted. Please respect the arena opening and closing hours as the show incurs extra charges when arena hours run over.
- The substitution of a horse in a class will be handled on an individual basis and at the discretion of the Show Committee.
- Substitution of rider can be made if requested prior to start of the session.

CALNASH AG EVENT CENTRE

The Calnash Ag Event Centre is an agricultural event centre located along Highway 2A and 39th Avenue in Ponoka, Alberta. There is easy access for both north and southbound traffic via Highway 2A and horse trailers can be off loaded at the large roll doors located on four sides of the barn. Truck and horse trailer units can be parked on the West side of the grounds during the show and trailers with living quarters may be unhitched and parked in a Calnash RV site.

Any and all barn stalls used by exhibitors must be returned to their original condition prior to leaving the grounds. Exhibitors will be invoiced for any alteration or damage to their stalls on the premises. To prevent the assessment of extra charges:

- ensure there is nothing nailed, stapled or tacked on stall walls
- do not dump water buckets in the stalls. Please use the wash rack.
- use the garbage cans provided to dispose of garbage from Dressing Rooms or Ready Rooms
- use a floor protector if using hoof black.

No dogs are allowed in the Barn, Pavilion or Arena with the exception of Service Dogs wearing their service vest for identification. Dogs are not permitted to be loose on the show grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained at all times. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. There are no exceptions.

These are Calnash Ag Event Centre policies that will be strictly enforced by facility staff.

- Bikes/Scooters/Skateboards are NOT to be ridden in the Barn, Pavilion or Arena.
- Fire Lanes on the Calnash site must be kept clear at all times
- Open fires are NOT allowed on the Calnash site.
- Wash racks are available.

R.V. HOOK UP AND PARKING

There are a limited number of Calnash RV sites with power hook up, available on a first come, first served basis. Calnash RV reservations should be made with exhibitor entries or through the Aurora Show Office upon arrival. First priority will be given to exhibitors that have pre-registered.

- **Any recreational vehicle, trailer or vehicle occupying a serviced site will be charged \$30.00 plus G.S.T. per night regardless of being connected to power.**
- 30-amp power is provided at serviced sites which requires an adapter.
- There are unserviced sites available at no charge in the field on the North side of the Barn and Arena.
- The Ponoka Stampede Campground, adjacent to the Calnash Ag Centre, offers fully serviced campsites and must be contacted directly to make a reservation.

STABLING

MOVE-IN	Exhibitors are welcome to move into the barns after 8:00 am on Thursday, June 4, 2020.
MOVE-OUT	All stalls must be vacated by 11:00 pm on Sunday, June 7, 2020 to avoid additional charges.

- Stalls are available for a fee of \$110.00 plus G.S.T. for a Horse or Tack Stall, Dressing or Ready Room, for June 4,5,6,7, 2020.
- Stalls are assigned on a first processed basis, with changes made as necessary to facilitate the smooth running of the show.
- Stalls are only guaranteed to exhibitors who submit their stabling requirements with their Entry Forms prior to the Entry Deadline.
- Stalls are mandatory for all exhibitors at the Aurora Summer Horse Show. Exhibitors are NOT permitted to trailer in and show horses out of their trailer.
- Exhibitors that have reserved stalls but wish to add stalls after the Entry Deadline are not guaranteed that the additional stalls will be in the same area of the stalls initially requested and assigned. Every effort will be made to accommodate additional stalls after the deadline but cannot be guaranteed.
- Exhibitors must have designated Ready Rooms or must use horse stalls to ensure the alleyways are kept clear.
- **Cross ties in the alleyways are not permitted as per insurance policy requirements.**
- Exhibitors are asked to ensure that adequate and safe access be maintained throughout all alleyways in the barn. Anyone limiting the use of these areas by other exhibitors, by any means, will be asked to correct the situation by the Show Manager.
- Exhibitors shall not move from their assigned stalls or trade stalls with another exhibitor without permission of the Show Office.
- Early stabling will be available Wednesday June 3, 2020 after 4:00 pm at an additional charge of \$25.00 plus G.S.T. per stall (Horse Stall, Tack Stall or Ready Room). If you choose early move-in, you do so at your own risk as the Calnash Ag Event Centre will not be providing security. Calnash staff will be conducting their daily stall checks and any stalls that are occupied before Thursday, June 4, 8:00 am, or have items stored in them will be invoiced. There will be no arena access until Thursday, 9:00 am. Contact our Stabling Manager to make arrangements for early stabling and it will be added to your show invoice.

5. If you are requesting a TBA Class, contact the Show Secretary, in advance of the show for approval and placement of the TBA class you require so the class is noted, and others can enter the class before the show.

ALL BREED PERFORMANCE JACKPOT CLASSES

DESIGNATED CLASSES

Hunter Pleasure Open Jackpot

Competitors enter the ring in a counter clockwise direction, at the trot. To be shown at a walk, trot, canter and a hand gallop, both directions of the ring. To stand quietly and back readily. The performance at each gait is considered equally in adjudicating this class. To be judged on manners, performance, quality, and conformation.

Western Pleasure Open Jackpot

Competitors enter the ring in a counter clockwise direction at the jog-trot. To be shown at a walk, jog-trot, lope and hand gallop, both directions of the ring. To be judged on manners, performance, substance, quality, conformation and attitude. The performance at each gait is considered equally in adjudicating this class. Light contact with the horse's mouth must be maintained at all gaits. A Junior horse may be shown in a hackamore or ring snaffle and may be ridden with two hands.

English Pleasure Open Jackpot

Competitors enter the ring in a counter clockwise direction at the normal trot. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter, both directions of the ring. To be judged on manners, performance, attitude, quality and conformation. It is imperative that the horse give the distinct appearance of being a pleasure to ride. A quiet, responsive mouth is paramount.

- Must be entered in two classes in the same division to be eligible for the Jackpot Class.
- Eligible qualifications can be from any All Breed, American Saddlebred, Arabian/Half Arabian/Anglo Arabian class. ie Western Jackpot; the horse could be entered in any Arabian class, Open or Amateur class and any All Breed class that is Western.
- The Jackpot Class Entry Fee is \$40.00.
- Jackpot Prizes will be paid out by cheque to the registered owner of the horse after class results have been submitted to the Show Secretary within 30 days of the Show. The Aurora Summer Horse Show will pay out the following in each All Breed Jackpot class:
1st place - \$400.00 2nd place - \$300.00 3rd place - \$100.00

AWARDS

- Arabian, Half Arabian, Anglo Arabian, American Saddlebred and All Breed classes will receive ribbons from 1st to 6th place.
- American Saddlebred Stake Classes: 1st place will be awarded a leather halter.
- All Junior Classes: 1st place will receive a ticket to redeem for a prize in the Show Office.
- Championship Classes: 1st place will be awarded a leather halter.

AURORA HIGH POINTS

To qualify for Aurora High Point Awards, a rider must be a member of the Aurora Arabian Horse Association, in good standing, in the current year. Points will be accumulated at up to four shows within Region 17 in the current calendar year. One show MUST be an Aurora Show. Others include any Class A show, Western Canadian Breeders & Region 17 Championships. National Shows are not included. High Point Awards will be presented at the General Meeting of the Aurora Arabian Horse Association held in January 2021.

- High Point Adult Rider
- High Point Sport Horse
- High Point Hunter Horse
- High Point Western Horse
- High Point English Horse
- Austin Whelihan High Point English Rider (Junior 18 years & Under)
- Paul Guthrie High Point Western Rider (Junior 18 years & Under)

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

1. For the Arabian Division, Junior Horses are 5 years and under as of January 1 of the current year.
2. For American Saddlebreds, Junior Horses are 4 years and under as of January 1 of the current year.
3. Other breeds are as per their regulations.
4. Stallions will not be permitted in any Junior Showmanship, Walk, Trot/Jog and Lead Line class.
5. Stallions are permitted in Junior exhibitor Performance classes.
6. Hors Concours will be allowed at this show. These entries must pay the same entry fees and are subject to the same conditions that apply to regular entries as outlined in the division rules. Hors concurs entries are not eligible for any awards. The Steward/Show Secretary must be notified.
7. In order to enter a breed specific Stake class, a horse must have competed in at least one class in the same division at this show.

8. To determine the number of horses in each class (in all classes ridden as a group) will be the number of horses that are competing at the closing of the gate at the beginning of the class. All those who pass through the gate in individual activity classes will determine the number of horses in each class.
9. The gate will close two minutes after the first horse enters the ring or with large classes taking more than two minutes, after the entry of the final horse in a continuous string of horses.
10. Combined ownership is allowed in Amateur Owner classes.
11. Participants in All Breed English Pleasure MUST wear Saddle Seat attire.
12. Exhibitors are considered Juniors by EC until their 19th birthday prior to December 1 of the previous calendar year.
13. For Breed specific classes the rules of that Breed will be used.
14. Exhibitors in A/HA/AA classes are considered Juniors by AHA if they have not yet reached their 19th birthday prior to December 1.
15. Exhibitors in a Lead Line class are not allowed to cross enter into any other performance class.
16. All Breed Walk/Trot/Jog classes are 11 years of age and under for this show.
17. A/HA/AA Walk/Trot/Jog classes are 10 years of age and under for this show.
18. Walk/Trot/Jog exhibitors are not allowed to show in any Performance class that has any gait other than a walk or a trot/jog. Showmanship is allowed; however, the Walk/Trot/Jog exhibitor MUST have a membership in Equestrian Canada for Showmanship classes.
19. All Walk-Trot/Jog exhibitors must enter the ring at a walk.
20. Assisted Walk/Trot/Jog 10 years & Under is not rated for EC awards. The purpose is to allow first time or nervous walk/trotters to become accustomed to time in the ring and to have a class experience. Each entry will be allowed a maximum of two people to enter the ring with them and stay with them during the class. Entries in this class will be able to cross enter into the walk/trot/jog classes however those classes will be run by the EC rules and must be ridden without assistance.
21. AHA Medal Rules and Class Specifications are referenced in the EC Breed Handbook ARTICLE B3608 and B3609.
22. Arabian Country English Pleasure may not cross enter Arabian English Pleasure or Arabian Pleasure Driving classes at this show.
23. Halter Classes will use "in the ring" procedure as identified in the Halter section of the Arabian Division in USEF/EC.
24. All classes not rated for EC awards will noted in Classes by Division.
25. In-Hand classes will use the current In-Hand score sheets as the method of scoring.
26. All Dressage classes will use Equestrian Canada Tests; All AHA Western Dressage classes will use Western Dressage Association of America (WDAA) tests.

ENTRY INFORMATION

THE CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES WITHOUT A LATE ENTRY FEE IS MONDAY, MAY 18, 2020

1. Entries must:
 - be complete and made on the correct, official entry form. There is an entry form for Arabian/Half Arabian/Anglo Arabian entries and an entry form for American Saddlebred and All Breed entries.
 - be accompanied by a cheque, bank draft or money order to cover all fees, payable to Aurora Arabian Horse Association OR accompanied by an e-transfer sent to auroraarabian@gmail.com
 - include copies of the following:
 - current registration papers, front & back: "must be in owner's name for owner classes" or a copy of a registered lease agreement or contract of sale (dated & signed)
 - AEF membership card
 - EC Sport License for each owner, rider, handler, driver, Person Responsible (see A801.6) seniors and youth.
 - AHA Competition card if showing an Arabian/Half Arabian/Anglo Arabian
 - record of vaccination as per EC ARTICLE A519
2. Entries will be considered incomplete if submitted without copies of all registration papers, all membership cards and record of vaccination. A processing fee of \$10.00 will apply to incomplete entries.
3. Entries received after May 18, 2020 will be considered a late entry and will pay a late entry fee of \$25.00 per horse.
4. Post entered classes will be accepted at the regular fee, up to a full session before the class is run. No post entry fee will be charged if the horse was entered into the show prior to May 18, 2020.
5. Only use the Class Number when completing the entry form. Do Not use the AHA code (second column) which is for AHA Office use only.
6. If you require a separate account to charge shavings, stalls or RV spots, please fill out an entry form with your name and barn and an account will be created. The show office will provide you with an account, separate from class fees.
7. All Junior competitor entries must be signed by a parent or legal guardian.
8. There will be a \$50.00 charge for any returned cheques. Exhibitors will not be permitted to show until the account is cleared by cash or e-transfer payment. Postdated cheques will not be accepted.
